1. Introduction

Stichting Mother's House was established on 20 January 2025 with the objective of supporting individuals facing psychological and emotional vulnerability. The foundation is committed to promoting healing, transformation, and consciousness development, regardless of social or financial background.

This preliminary report provides an overview of the foundation's legal formation, activities, donations, and financials during the first quarter of operations.

Stichting Mother's House supports individuals dealing with:

- Addiction and substance recovery
- PTSD and trauma
- Depression and suicidal ideation
- Eating disorders and body-image trauma
- Anxiety, existential crises, and burnout
- Grief, bereavement, and end-of-life accompaniment

We promote holistic and integrative support methods including transpersonal psychology, therapeutic retreats, trauma-informed guidance, and ceremonial integration.
